TONIGHT'S HONOREES

PROFESSOR BRENDA BRATTON BLOM

Brenda Bratton Blom is the daughter of a Methodist minister and a music teacher from San Angelo, Texas. After working in a variety of careers from coal mining to shepherddressing, Professor Blom married and moved to Baltimore, where she and her husband, John, raised their family. She is a 1993 graduate of the University of Baltimore School of Law, and in 2002 earned her Ph.D. in Policy Science/Legal Policy from the University of Maryland, Baltimore County. Her doctoral thesis, "How Close to Justice", was an investigative study into the relocation of residents from Baltimore's Fairfield and Wagner's Point neighborhoods following the discovery of carcinogenic discharge from nearby chemical plants.

Before joining the faculty at University of Maryland School of Law, Professor Blom worked as a staff attorney at the Community Law Center, where she managed vacant house receivership cases and provided legal representation to community organizations. As executive director of Empowerment Legal Services in 1996-1998, Professor Blom provided counsel to Baltimore's Empowerment Zone, advising on legal matters ranging from incorporation and property transfers to quality of life nuisance crimes and tenants' rights.

As a member of the law school faculty since 1996, Professor Blom has taught clinical courses in Economic, Housing, and Community Development; Community Justice; and Professional Responsibility. Her most recent teaching endeavor is the Community Justice Clinic, which targets reforming the ways our criminal justice system interfaces with communities. She has directed the school's prestigious clinical program since 2003, and continues to provide legal counsel to community-based organizations on issues ranging from housing development to public safety. She is also faculty co-editor of The Authority, a quarterly housing law digest published by the Housing and Development Law Institute and distributed nationally to public housing and redevelopment authorities.

Her scholarship includes published articles on cause lawyering and social movements, community development for the 21st Century, and seeking work-life balance. She has participated in panels on topics as diverse as fair housing, coalition-building, legal strategies for ex-offender re-entry, and environmental law issues in housing development. In Spring 2007, Professor Blom hosted a national conference at the University of Maryland on innovative practices in community justice.

Ever active in civic life, Professor Blom has given generously of her time and leadership over the years through her service to the Park School Parents Association; her membership on the board of Greensboro Justice Fund, Inc; her leadership at Stony Run Friends Meeting House; and as Secretary of the board of Civil Justice, Inc, a Baltimore-based non profit seeking to increase delivery of legal services to clients of low and moderate income through a state-wide network of like-minded lawyers. Professor Blom's many accomplishments in her brilliant legal career have left an indelible mark on the neighborhoods of Baltimore City and the lives of those she has touched.

TONIGHT'S HONOREES

DEAN KAREN ROTHENBERG

Karen H. Rothenberg, J.D., M.P.A., is the Dean, Marjorie Cook Professor of Law, and founding Director of the nationally recognized Law & Health Care Program at the University of Maryland School of Law. The first woman to serve as chief executive and academic officer in the law school's 185-year history, Dean Rothenberg has led Maryland to new heights of accomplishment while continuing to produce cutting-edge scholarship on issues at the intersection of women's health care and the law.

Since Dean Rothenberg's appointment in 2000, the School of Law has opened a new, state-of-the-art academic facility, strengthened its national leadership in legal areas including health care, the environment and clinical education, and ascended into the top tier of law schools. Under her leadership, Maryland Law has leveraged its connections with the regional legal and business communities to enhance students' educational and employment opportunities, established itself as a national leader in diversity among faculty and students, and increased the professionalization of its administration. Dean Rothenberg holds direct managerial responsibility for the law school's \$35 million annual operating budget and oversees the management of its \$43 million endowment. She has successfully completed a \$12 million building campaign, and recently announced the public launch of a new campaign that already has raised more than half of its \$50 million goal.

As a faculty member, Dean Rothenberg founded the innovative Law & Health Care Program, which U.S. News & World Report ranked third nationally in 2008. Since becoming Dean, she has overseen the creation of numerous additional centers, programs, and initiatives, including the Women, Leadership & Equality Program, which is dedicated to the development of lawyers who recognize the barriers women face in assuming leadership roles in society and work to surmount such obstacles.

Dean Rothenberg serves on the board of the Kaiser Foundation Health Plan of the Mid-Atlantic States and is Academic Advisor to the Business Women's Initiative Against HIV/AIDS. She has served on the Maryland Stem Cell Research Commission since its inception, was named its Chair in 2008, and also advised the NIH on the awarding of grants as a member of its National Advisory Child Health and Human Development Council. Dean Rothenberg is a member of the ABA Task Force on Law School Accreditation, serves on the Board of Directors for the American Law Deans Association, and is a past president of the American Society of Law, Medicine and Ethics.

An accomplished scholar and expert on issues at the intersection of health care, gender, and law, Dean Rothenberg's research interests include the legal and social implications of genetic testing, women's health, the rights of patients and human subjects, AIDS, and access to health care. She is co-editor of the book *Women and Prenatal Testing: Facing the Challenges of Genetic Technology* and author of numerous articles on genetics and public policy. Dean Rothenberg has testified before federal and state legislatures on a wide range of issues, including the U.S. House of Representatives' Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act of 2007, and is a recipient of the American Society of Law, Medicine & Ethics' Joseph Healey Health Law Teachers Award.

Historically a trailblazer, Dean Rothenberg was a member of the first graduating class of women at Princeton University, where she received both her B.A., magna cum laude, and M.P.A. from the Wilson School of Public and International Affairs. An Order of the Coif graduate from the University of Virginia School of Law, she practiced with the Washington, D.C. law firm of Covington and Burling, and in 1983 became one of a few women on the Maryland School of Law's faculty.

In 2007, Dean Rothenberg received Equal Justice Works' Dean John R. Kramer Award in recognition of her national prominence in promoting public service in legal education, was inducted into the Maryland Commission for Women's Hall of Fame, and was named to the *Daily Record's* inaugural group of "50 Most Influential Marylanders." This year, she was named one of Maryland's Top 100 Women for the third time by the *Daily Record*, and earned induction to the publication's Circle of Excellence.

1. Attendee must register in order to receive a personal bidder number.

3. MPILP accepts cash, check, or credit card (Visa, Master Card).
4. For donations requiring contact with the donor, buyers are responsible for making the initial contact.
5. Winning bidders will receive their item(s) or, if applicable, instructions on securing good(s)/service(s) at Check Out.
6. Buyers of all “getaways” and other auction items that involve the temporary use of a donor’s property shall return the property to the donor in the condition in which it was received. Any additional charges incurred are the buyer’s responsibility.
7. Buyers waive any claims for liability against MPILP, auction staff, and donors of property or services. MPILP, its auction staff, and donors are not responsible for any personal injuries or damages that may result from the use of property or services sold.
