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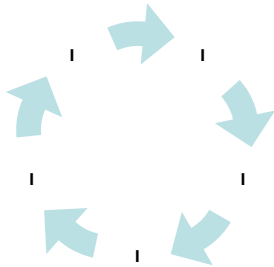
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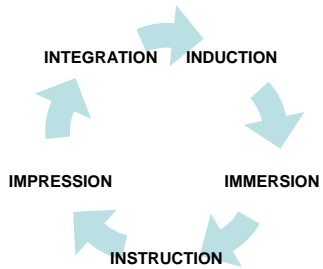
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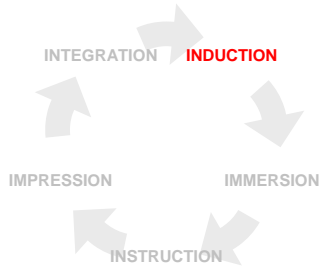
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## Induction

### DO

- Read all assigned cases
- Pay attention to the theme of cases
- Consider how case themes fit into context
- Figure out what study environment is best for you
- Schedule your study time

### DO NOT

- Skip cases
- Allow yourself to fall behind
- Let distractions cause you to lose your focus
- Wing it

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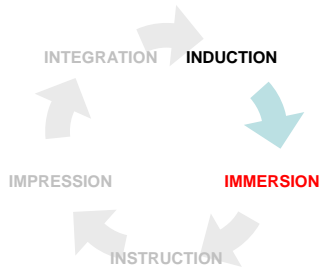
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## Immersion

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| <p><b>DO</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Read cases a second time, reading carefully</li><li>• Read again (and again) until you understand</li><li>• Record your understanding (Briefing, notes, highlighting)</li><li>• Anticipate questions/hypos</li><li>• Discuss your understanding with others (Study partners/groups)</li></ul> | <p><b>DO NOT</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Think that your first read of the case was enough</li><li>• Worry about how other people are preparing</li><li>• Work so hard that you forget to take care of yourself (In other words, remember to eat and work out)</li></ul> |
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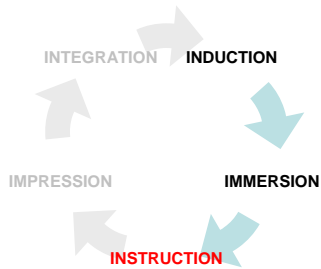
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## Instruction

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| <p><b>DO</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Actively participate in class</li><li>• Take notes in the best way for <b><i>you</i></b></li><li>• Take <b><i>good</i></b> notes</li><li>• Pay attention and take note of in-class hypotheticals</li></ul> | <p><b>DO NOT</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Skip class</li><li>• Fear the Socratic method</li><li>• Transcribe the class on your laptop</li><li>• Spend your time instant messaging, gaming, or surfing the web</li><li>• Fall asleep during class</li><li>• Wait until class to learn the material</li></ul> |
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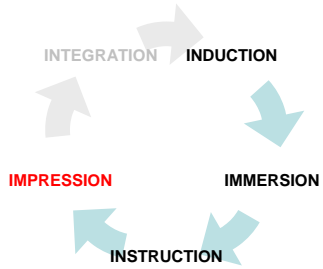
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## Impression

### **DO**

- Review class notes
- Compare with your study notes/briefs
- Fill in any blanks and make corrections
- Ask questions of your Professor
- Review with partner/groups

### **DO NOT**

- Put your notes away until the end of the semester
- Let questions linger without addressing them

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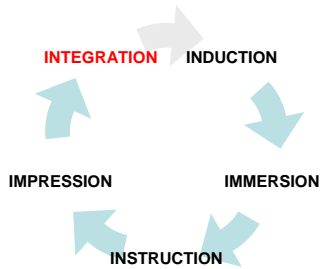
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## INTEGRATION

### DO

- Organize your notes along with other notes
- Consider outlining early

### DO NOT

- Simply put your notes away, with the intention of revisiting them in a few months
- Burn, eat, or flush your notes
- Give up
- Forget to take care of yourself

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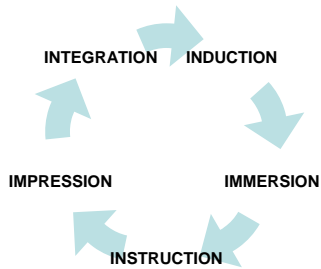
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
