



HOW TO USE REMOTE DESKTOP and VPN FOR MAC
With multi-factor authentication/DUO
(using Mac OS Sierra)

<p>Access the Remote Desktop App and the Cisco AnyConnect Secure Mobility Client in the Launchpad.</p>	
<p>Click the Cisco Client icon to connect to the VPN.</p> <p>Be sure that “vpn.umaryland.edu” is entered in the box and click Connect.</p>	

HOW TO USE REMOTE DESKTOP and VPN FOR MAC

With multi-factor authentication/DUO

(using Mac OS Sierra)

In the next box, select your Group, (by clicking the up/down blue arrows) depending on your affiliation with the Law School, "Law or Law-Clinic-Students."


Enter your UMBID in the Username box and your UMBID Password in the first Password box.

Options for Second Password include

- 1 • push
Sends a DUO confirmation request to the DUO Mobile app on your phone or tablet

- 2 • passcode
Enter the passcode generated on the DUO Mobile app or hardware token.

Click OK.



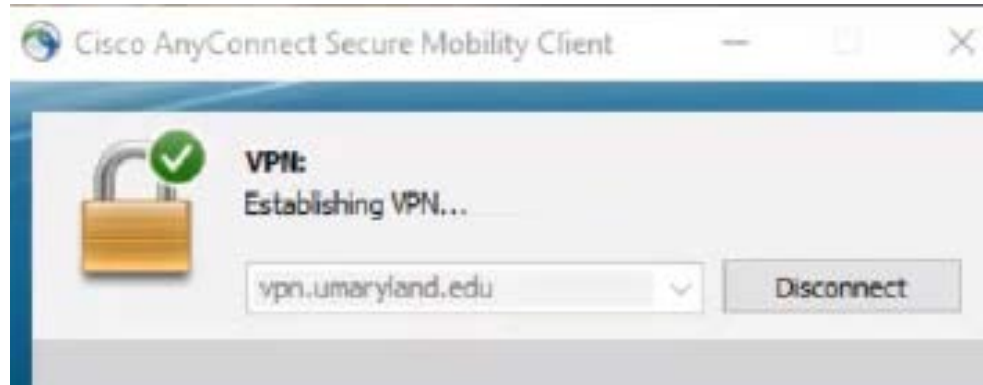
